



Dear Dairy Cattle Exhibitors:

We are excited to be hosting another Spring Dairy Expo (SDE) in 2018. We appreciate your participation and look forward to seeing the beautiful dairy cows and heifers of the Midwest on parade in March. Our dates for this year's event are March 29, 30 & 31st, 2018 at the Ohio Expo Center in Columbus, Ohio. Enclosed you will find a copy of our schedule of events, class list, health requirements for Ohio and entry form. Entries must be postmarked by Thursday, March 1, 2018 to avoid additional charges. Additional entry forms may be printed from the website at www.springdairyexpo.com or by email to julie@cobaselect.com. Animals entered via email are not considered complete until the entry fee is received.

The 2018 SDE will again highlight junior activities with the state 4-H judging contest and youth showmanship classes. In addition, we will have the seven outstanding sales, and the Mid-East ADA complimentary dinner. We are working on final details for live-streaming of the showmanship classes and other parts of the breed shows and sales. Please be sure to acknowledge our show sponsors throughout the year. Without their support, we would not be able to host such an outstanding event. There have been several schedule changes so please be sure to pay close attention to show and sale schedule in this packet.

At this year's SDE, the Ohio Department of Agriculture (ODA) will again be doing quality assurance testing. ODA's Quality Assurance Testing includes ensuring that the PDCA Code of Ethics is followed in all shows and exhibitions. In accordance with this requirement, ODA personnel may visually inspect, take milk samples from the grand champion and reserve grand champion and ultrasound udders at the breeds' requests. Show management continues to work with ODA to ensure that you can exhibit your animals to their greatest advantage within the PDCA guidelines and that exhibitors are not subject to unreasonable demands. Thank you for your cooperation!

Here are some important facts to be aware of:

1. In keeping with the State Fair policy regarding tents in stall areas, only one tent will be allowed per show string (not per exhibitor). There must be one smoke detector per tent per mandatory guidelines of Fire Marshall. Non-compliance will result in removal of tent.
2. Sunday (March 25th) bedding only (no animals) will be permitted in the Gilligan Building between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.
3. Red and white animals may be shown in both the Holstein and the Red and White shows. In order to do so, you must enter in both breeds, pay two entry fees and present both registration papers. If you have additional questions, please contact your breed representatives.
4. All damages to facilities will be directly billed to the exhibitor via the Ohio Expo Center, SDE will not assume responsibility.

Component Merit Class - Lifetime Production of at least 7,500 pounds combined fat and protein

Jr. Best Three Females-All under 2-yr- of age, none fresh, all bred with at least one owned by exhibitor.

Intermediate Champion-Brown Swiss, Holstein & Red and White class winners 13,14,15,16; Jersey class winners 13, 14, 15.

125,000 Pound Class-cow that has produced at least 125,000 pounds of milk. (Red and White only).

150,000 Pound Class-cow that has produced at least 150,000 pounds of milk. (Holstein only).

**Production papers need to be on file with breed representatives to participate.

Senior and Reserve Senior Champion Female-Winners of classes 13,14,15,16,18,19,20,21,22,23,24

as offered by the respective breeds for those breeds without an Intermediate Champion.

Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Female-winners of Classes 12 & 25.

Best Three Females-Three females, any age, all 3 bred and at least one animal owned by exhibitor.

Dam & Daughter-Dam and her own daughter, any ages.

Produce of Dam-Group to consist of 2 animals, any age, either sex, the produce of one cow. Dam must be named.

Best Bred & Owned -

Premier Exhibitor-The exhibitor winning the most points on not to exceed six animals owned and exhibited by himself in the open single class. See rules page for more details.

Premier Breeder-The breeder winning the most points on not to exceed six animals in the open single classes, exhibited by himself and/or other exhibitors. See rules page for more details.

2018 Spring Dairy Expo Entry Rules

Ownership: To be eligible for competition, whether single or in-groups, animals must be entered exactly as ownership appears on the registration certificate. The registration certificate showing the most recent date of activity will be considered official. Registration certificates must be available for check-in by the breed superintendent at the time of arrival. **All registration papers will be held until the completion of the show.**

Transfers: Each breed will handle the ownership rules according to the rules established by the National and/or State Association. The rules by breed are listed below. If you need further clarification, please contact your State Breed Association contacts.

Ayrshire - Junior animals must be owned solely by junior or in partnership with the juniors' name on the official registration certificate. All animals must have an official certificate no showing on transfer papers will be allowed.

Brown Swiss - The animal must be registered in the name of the Exhibitor. The paper must be an official paper from the Brown Swiss Cattle Breeder's Association. The recorded ownership must show in the sole ownership of the exhibitor or partnership comprised of only BSA Junior Members (adult-junior and family farm partnerships are not acceptable). If joint ownership, one of the owners must be declared the exhibitor during check-in. Awards will be presented as one unit, to all owners equally. Junior members who have an animal on a national lease program can participate in the national junior show. They will need to bring the lease paper along with the registration paper. The owner of the leased animal will receive recognition as the owner in the open show.

Guernsey - Positive, readable ID must be available by sketch or tattoo. No transfers allowed.

Holstein - This is a designated Spring National Holstein Open and Junior Show and will follow Holstein USA Open & Junior Show Ring Policy; which is available online at: http://www.holsteinusa.com/pdf/print_material/show_program.pdf.

All Holsteins must be a minimum of 87% as indicated by their registration certificate. Holsteins can show on a signed transfer as long as the paper, signed transfer and transfer fees are turned into the breed representatives.

- **Premier Exhibitor & Breeder Points** – Milking females will accumulate points on the National Holstein Show scale 40-point system, junior females and dry cows will be on the 20-point system. All other breeds will use a 20 scale for milking animals and 10 for heifers and dry cows
- **Premier Exhibitor:** For premier exhibitor calculations the exhibitor of an animal will be as ownership appears on the registration certificate.
 1. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as the result of one exhibitor.
 2. Partnership or syndicate animals will be calculated as exhibited by the partnership or syndicate and not by any single partner or syndicate member.
- **Breeder Defined** – The owner of the dam at the time of service shall be considered the breeder of the animal. Where a herd is registered in the names of different members of a family and where the herd is one unit, all entries may be considered as exhibits of one breeder.

Jersey - Showing on transfers will NOT be allowed. Exhibitors must have an official registration certificate.

Milking Shorthorn – Showing on transfers will be allowed for animals purchased within 30 days of the show. All animals must show in the proper class. Junior animals must list the junior's name, for example, John Doe of Doe Farms. The national black hair rule will apply.

Substitutions: Substitutions are allowed in the same class with the same-recorded owner or herd unit of the SAME breed. In addition, ONE open substitution (out of class) will be allowed per herd unit of the SAME breed. Once an animal has been substituted, the original animal entered shall be eliminated from the competition.

Dress Code: **ALL EXHIBITORS ARE REQUIRED TO WEAR WHITE TROUSERS** or white skirts and official harness when leading animals in the ring. Violators will not be permitted to enter the ring.

Premiums: The monetary award for all breed grand champions (\$100) and breed junior champions (\$50) will be presented during the supreme champion class at the conclusion of the show. If an animal chooses not to participate in Supreme Champion class the monetary award will be forfeited. These champion awards are sponsored annually by the *Ohio Purebred Dairy Cattle Association*.

Quality Assurance Testing

- The Ohio Department of Agriculture has indicated that the OH Livestock Show Reform Act signed in June 1995; which includes all county and independent fairs, the Ohio State Fair, and all preview or jackpot shows or any exhibition over 36 hours in duration or has livestock whose origin is not OHIO, states Quality Assurance testing will be mandatory in the year 2018.
- In compliance with this Statute we are held to allow testing to be done at the SDE 2018.
- **Quality Assurance testing means Ohio Department of Agriculture has the option of taking milk samples, ultra sounding udders, at the request of breed officials and visually checking for excessive manipulation of hair.**

Exhibitors are responsible for being ringside for the class. The announcer will make every effort to keep the barn informed of show progress. However, show management is NOT responsible if you miss a class.

2018 JUNIOR SHOW ALL BREED SHOWMANSHIP

*Cash Awards for All Participants Sponsored by **American Dairy Association***

Friday, March 30th, 3:00 p.m., Voinovich Building

Spring Dairy Expo All Breed Youth Showmanship will showcase our junior's skill and ability. Pre-entry at the show is required with actual birth date. There will be sign-ups on the Bulletin Board outside the dairy office in the Gilligan Building. You can also contact Sherry Smith to register at smith.10072@osu.edu or 330.465.2376.

Classes will be formed by show management based on the number of participants. There will be three age groups showing at the same time. We will start with the youngest age groups at 3:00 pm. Showmanship participants do not need to own the animals they show.

Age is determined as of January 1, 2018. Must be 9 years old or in the 3rd grade and less than 21 on January 1 of the current year to participate in showmanship.

UNIFIED JUNIOR SHOW GUIDELINES

- Junior Exhibitors must be at least 9 or in the 3rd grade and less than 21 on January 1 of the current year to show in the Junior Show.
- **Junior Exhibitors must show their own animals to be considered for Junior Show Awards.** *If an adult shows the junior project, that project is NOT eligible to receive junior awards or recognition.*
- Exceptions will be made for junior exhibitors who may be absent on show day due to other commitments. In case of these exceptions, another boy or girl who meets the age requirements of the Junior Show may show the animal with the authorization of the breed superintendent. These junior exhibitors, who cannot be present to show their own animal(s), must provide to the breed superintendent a written notice verifying such and signed by the person in charge of the conflicting activity prior to the start of the show.

JUDGING CONTESTS

State 4-H Dairy – Thursday, March 29th at 8:45 am (registration from 7:30 to 8:30 am)

Registration and contest will be in the Voinovich building. There are 3 separate divisions, Junior (8-11), Intermediate (12-14), and Senior (15 and up). The Intermediate division will give two sets of reasons with notes and senior division will present two sets of reasons, without notes. All three Divisions will answer three questions. **Please pre-register by March 19th! Spring Dairy Expo Health Requirements

901:1-18-01 Chapter's application.

(A) Animals listed in this chapter when moved or imported into Ohio for exhibition purposes only shall comply with the requirements of this chapter and when in compliance with the provisions of this chapter shall, with the exception of rules governing movement and importation of quarantined animals, be exempt from any other rules governing movement within or importation into Ohio.

(B) Animals moved within or imported into Ohio for any purpose in addition to exhibition shall meet all movement and import requirements of Chapter 901:1-17 of the Administrative Code.

901:1-18-02 Definitions.

As used in this chapter:

(A) "Exhibition" means any public show of animals which is sponsored by or under the control of an Ohio county or independent agricultural society organized under Chapter 1711. of the Revised Code; or the Ohio state fair; or which is assembled for a period which exceeds thirty-six hours or contains animals of origins other than Ohio.

(B) "Certificate of veterinary inspection" means a form from the state of origin which has been issued and completed by a licensed and accredited veterinarian attesting to the health status and identification of an animal listed thereon.

(C) "Approved veterinarian" means any licensed and accredited veterinarian approved by the Ohio department of agriculture, or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture or the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services.

(D) "Licensed and accredited veterinarian" means a person who is licensed by the state of Ohio to practice veterinary medicine and who is certified by the United States department of agriculture, animal plant health inspection service, veterinary services, to be an accredited veterinarian.

(E) "Residue" means any poisonous or deleterious pesticide governed by 40 C.F.R. 180, any poisonous or deleterious substance governed by 21 C.F.R. 109.6, or any other substance governed by 21 C.F.R. 556.

(F) "Contagious or infectious disease" means any disease, including any foreign animal disease, or vector, capable of transmission by any means from a carrier animal to a human or to another animal and includes dangerously contagious or infectious diseases.

(G) "Tuberculosis accredited free herd" is one that has passed at least two consecutive annual negative official tests for tuberculosis in accordance with the "Uniform Methods and Rules – Bovine Tuberculosis Eradication", and has no other evidence of bovine tuberculosis.

901:1-18-04 Exhibitors.

(A) No person shall present for exhibition or exhibit an animal which he knows or has reason to suspect is affected with or has been exposed to a dangerously contagious or infectious disease or residue.

(B) The owner or bailee of an animal with symptoms of an infectious or contagious disease shall, when directed by an exhibition official, the approved veterinarian, or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture, immediately remove the animal from the exhibition premises.

(C) Upon request, each person who presents for exhibition or exhibits an animal, shall make available any certificate of veterinary inspection, registration certificates, vaccination certificate, and other documents to exhibition officials, the approved veterinarian or an employee of the Ohio department of agriculture.

(D) Each person who presents for exhibition or exhibits an animal for which a certificate of veterinary inspection is required by rules [901:1-18-01](#) to [901:1-18-11](#) of the Administrative Code shall forward a copy of the certificate of veterinary inspection to the Ohio department of agriculture's division of animal health.

901:1-18-06 Cattle.

(A) Cattle moved within Ohio for exhibition:

(1) The animals presented for exhibition must show no symptoms or evidence of an infectious or contagious disease.

(B) All cattle imported into Ohio for exhibition must:

(1) Be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within thirty days preceding the opening date of the exhibition and be identified with official individual identification;

(2) Originate from a tuberculosis-accredited free herd, an accredited free state or zone, or a modified accredited advanced state or zone;

(3) If originate from a modified accredited state or zone must comply with rule 901:1-17-03 of the Administrative Code;

(4) If originate from an accreditation preparatory or a non-accredited state or zone are prohibited from exhibition;

(5) If from a brucellosis class A state or area/zone must be negative to an official brucellosis test within thirty days of the opening date of the exhibition unless: they are under six months of age, steers, or official vaccinates under twenty months of age (dairy) or twenty-four months of age (beef); and

(6) If from a brucellosis class B or C state or area/zone must meet all requirements for pre-entry testing as specified in 9 C.F.R. 78.9 and obtain an Ohio permit prior to movement.

(C) Cattle from a brucellosis certified free herd or class free state or area/zone are not required to be brucellosis tested.
